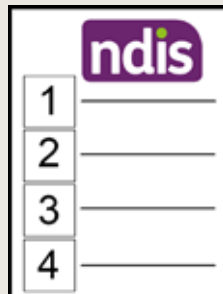

Plan reviews help you to think about

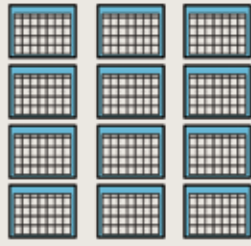
- what works well

- your future goals.

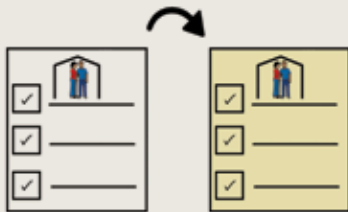


When do plan reviews happen?

Your first plan review happens at the end of year 1 in the NDIS.



At your first plan review you can tell us how long you want your plan to be.



You can ask for a short plan if your needs might change.

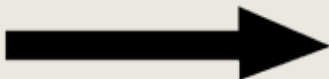
For example

- you will move from school to work
- you will move to a new house.



A short plan might be 12 months.

You can ask for a long plan if your needs will stay the same.



A long plan might be 2 years.



Who will do your plan review?

The National Disability Insurance Agency works with different groups to deliver the NDIS.



These groups understand

- the needs of people with disability

- the local community.



The groups employ people called

- Local Area Coordinators



- Early Childhood Partners.



Some people will have a Support Coordinator to help with the plan review.



These people help you with your plan and your plan reviews.



Early Childhood Partners will do plan reviews for children aged 0 to 6 years.



Local Area Coordinators and Support Coordinators will do plan reviews for people aged 7 to 65 years.



The plan reviews might happen

- at a meeting
- by phone.



Everyone will get the same access to supports and services.

We want you to achieve your goals.

Early intervention support

Early intervention support is for **eligible**



- children

and



- adults.



Early intervention means people get help early.

Early intervention might help people to be more independent later in life.



Eligible means people meet the NDIS rules.



We need to check people are eligible for early intervention support at each plan review.

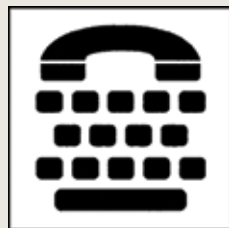
